#### HEALTH AND SAFETY UPDATE

Staring July 1st the requirements for Mandatory health and safety awareness training for all workers (not just construction) comes into effect. This training focuses on safety rights and responsibilities and serves as a general introduction to workplace health and safety. The training is **available online** through the Ministry of Labour at no cost. Consider asking for a letter confirming the completion of this training from all of your sub-contractors. This may inspire them to get it done. It also may serve in a small way to due diligence.

Mandatory Supervisor Health and Safety Awareness training also takes effect on July 1st. This training introduces supervisors to the Occupational Health and Safety Act. The Program can be completed by using the workbook or the Ministry of Labour's e-Learning module. The online module takes 45-60 minutes to complete. You must save or print the certificate as the ministry will not maintain records. This mandatory training requirement is also available through the Ministry of Labour at no cost.

#### NOT ACTIVE- MANDATORY FALL PROTECTION TRAINING FOR WORKERS

The Ministry of Labour has created a new training standard for Working at Heights. The standard is currently voluntary and there has not been a regulation in place to validate the new requirements. The Working At Heights Training Program Standard would include two modules, both theory and practical, with a duration of both modules lasting 3 and 3.5 hours each. The Ministry had completed a consultation on the proposed new mandatory requirements. OHBA Health and Safety Chair, Bruce Bolduc, OHBA members and OHBA staff participated in the consultations and requested grandfathering and transition provisions for workers that had already completed similar training as well as a reasonable transition timetable for workers who were not trained prior to the regulation. Only Ministry approved trainers will be able to train workers. The Ministry has not announced the process of how to apply to become a licensed trainer or the curriculum the standard must comply with. OHBA will provide additional details when they become available.

#### NOT ACTIVE- MANDATORY ENTRY LEVEL TRAINING FOR CONSTRUCTION

One of the recommendations from the Tony Dean Report was for the Ministry to develop mandatory entry-level training for construction workers. The Ministry has yet to publicly consult on this proposal on what the requirements, length, and type of training this would encompass.

#### OCOT BOARD PASSES 2-YEAR IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR SPRINKLER AND FIRE PROTECTION INSTALLER TRADE

The Ontario College of Trades' (OCOT) Board of Governors has approved the development of a regulation that, if passed, would allow for a two-year implementation plan for the reclassification of the Sprinkler and Fire Protection Installer trade from voluntary to compulsory membership in OCOT. On April 23, 2014, OCOT received the <u>independent Review Panel's decision</u> split decision in favor of moving this to a compulsory trade. OHBA participated in this consultation advocating for the trade to remain voluntary due to the potential challenges in labour supply for this trade as well as logistical consideration as there is only one training delivery agent in the entire province.

The OCOT Board of Governors has approved a 'grandparenting' provision — an exemption from the Certificate of Qualification (C of Q) exam for the trade will be available to qualified candidates during the first year of the two-year implementation period. The exam exemption would apply to individuals who are engaging in the work of the Sprinkler and Fire Protection Installer trade who do not have a C of Q in the trade, but who have a Certificate of Apprenticeship (C of A) in the trade or who have qualifications and experience that are equivalent to a C of A in the trade. In the second year, the exam exemption would no longer be available, though individuals could continue to work legally while they challenge the C of Q exam. At the end of the two-year implementation period, the trade will be compulsory — meaning that everyone working in the trade in Ontario must be certified in the trade and a member in good standing with OCOT.

The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities is still ultimately responsible for developing the regulation to make this trade compulsory. The Sprinkler and Fire Protection decision came just prior to the Ontario Liberal Platform announcement for a pause in compulsory certification applications and planned review of the compulsory certification process. This is the only trade that has gone through the OCOT compulsory certification review and OHBA had concerns with both the process and the majority decision. We welcome the Liberal Government's Platform commitment as it recognizes the deep concerns OHBA had with that process.

OHBA will be seeking clarity from Minister Reza Moridi as we continue to have concerns in how the certification process will be implemented for this trade.

## **ONTARIO ELECTION**

Today Premier Kathleen Wynne, along with the rest of the MPPs, will return to Queen's Park to re-open the legislature and to elect a new speaker. Tomorrow the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario will deliver the Throne Speech which will map out the government's priorities moving forward. Premier Wynne and the Ontario Liberal Party were elected into a majority government on June 12th winning 58 seats. The PC Party took 28 seats and MPP Tim Hudak resigned his position as Leader. Earlier today the PC Caucus chose MPP Jim Wilson (Simcoe-Grey) as their interim Leader. The NDP were elected in 21 ridings. OHBA issued a <u>media release</u> congratulating Premier Wynne and the Liberals on their Liberal majority.

Last week Premier Wynne announced the new members of cabinet. OHBA congratulates the Honourable Ted McMeekin on his new position as Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, the Honourable Steven Del Duca on becoming Minister of Transportation and the Honourable Reza Moridi on his new role as Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities. <u>OHBA looks forward to working with all ministers</u> on files of importance to the industry and the association.
