WSIB PREMIUM RATES UNCHANGED FOR 2015

The Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB) announced today that in 2015, for the second consecutive year, premium rates will be maintained at current levels for the majority of employers. The WSIB Maximum Insurable Earnings Ceiling for 2015 is \$85,200. This is an increase of 1.3 per cent from \$84,100 in 2014. Changes to the Maximum Insurable Earnings Ceiling are directly linked to changes in average earnings in Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada, and provisions under the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act

Since 2004, construction injuries have declined by 36 per cent, and yet, over the same time period, the average maximum construction premium per worker has increased by 41 per cent. Employers are continually investing in health and safety training and technologies, but they have not seen a return for this investment through decreasing premium rates in over a decade. By way of comparison, a home builder in Alberta pays \$1,698 to insure a worker earning \$100,000. The same employer in Ontario would pay 4 ½ times this amount to cover the same amount of risk. OHBA is advocating for changes to WSIB premium rates that would introduce more fairness that considers the true risk profile for employers.

MTO - CORRIDOR PERMIT FEE STRUCTURE

The Ministry of Transportation (MTO) is currently reviewing their corridor permit fee structure. MTO currently reviews applications and issues permits for encroachments, building and land use (B&LU), entrances and signs to ensure safety, operating efficiency of public highways and to protect highway corridors for future expansion. The current fee structure was not developed on the basis of the recovery of administrative costs and the Ministry is now consulting with stakeholders as they consider moving to a full cost recovery model.

The MTO is considering a number of changes to adjust the corridor management permit fee structure to:

- Reflect the cost of administration/review
- Minimize "cross-subsidization of fees" by basing fees on the complexity of the review, rather than the current structure based on the size of the development (for commercial development)
- Move fees closer to full cost recovery (from current 35 per cent cost recovery to approximately 50 per cent cost recovery)
- Include an annual inflationary increase

MTO will continue to consult with stakeholders including OHBA and finalize proposed changes to the fee structure and submit for approval through 2015/16. The proposed new fee structure will have a phased implementation period through 2016-2021.

OHBA HOUSING TECHNOLOGY TOUR

With Doug Tarry Jr. of Doug Tarry Homes as our host, industry delegates embarked on the Ontario Home Builders' Association's (OHBA) housing technology tour from the GTA to Hamilton, to showcase some of the practices that are changing the future of home building. Our housing tour visited three locations, Brockport Home Systems, Minto's Southshore site and Multi-Area Developments Discovery Home.

Brockport, a division of Great Gulf Homes, is leading the way for automated assembly in new home construction. Each home is digitally constructed through the use of sophisticated 3D modelling then physically and constructed inside the controlled environment of Brockport's state-of-the art facility. Our second stop on the tour brought us to Minto's Southshore stacked townhouse project. Targeting LEED Silver, ENERGY STAR for New Homes and Tier 2



of the Toronto Green Standard, the project showcases the latest strategies being used to minimize environmental pressures, including the urban heat island effect. Our last stop took us to Hamilton with Multi-Area Developments' discovery home under Union Gas' Optimum Home Program. Through the Optimum Home Program's leading-edge technical support and whole-house approach, the builder found solutions to design challenges in order to produce some of the most efficient homes on the market.
