Ontario Housing Starts Surge New Housing Supporting Job Creation

November 8, 2011 - Toronto, ON - "Housing starts, led by the multi-family sector surged in October supporting economic growth and job creation," stated Ontario Home Builders' Association President Doug Tarry, who added, "The housing start numbers released today demonstrate our resiliency as housing construction activity held its own in the face of strong global economic headwinds."

Tarry added, "It is imperative during times of economic uncertainty that the provincial government work with the new housing and development industry to ensure we continue to have a stable market and support consumer confidence. Despite the strong performance of the housing market the past few months, I would caution that Ontarians without a job or with no job security are highly unlikely to purchase a new home or consider major renovations." Tarry highlighted OHBA priorities with the new provincial government, and said "There is much work to be done on many files such as resolving the regional official plan status, implementation of the energy efficiency requirements in the Building Code, tackling the underground economy and improving the apprenticeship system."
