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# Bill 108 – Community Benefits Regulation and Transition Regulations

On June 21st, the province posted three sets of proposed Regulations for consultation related to various elements of Bill 108, which received Royal Assei June 6th. As a reminder, the majority of significant changes, including amendments to LPAT, the *Development Charges Act* and the *Planning Act*, will not effect until the related Regulations are finalized and various component of the Bill are proclaimed.

With respect to the proposed Community Benefits Charges the first set of proposed framework-related Regulations have been posted and will lead to a se consultation with a proposed set of formula-related Regulations which will then be followed by final Regulations, with this work to be wrapped up by March If they are in a position to do so, municipalities may use the new Community Benefits Authority system as of January 1, 2020. Municipalities will then hav January 1, 2021 to do all the policy/by-law work necessary to be in compliance with Bill 108, including having a Community Benefits Authority in place – u otherwise stated (ie. through various pieces being proclaimed).

The current three posted regulations for consultation are as follows:

- A proposed new regulation pertaining to the community benefits authority under the Planning Act (ERO 019-0183) for 63 days until August 23.
- A proposed a new regulation and regulation changes under the Planning Act, including transition matters, related to Schedule 12 of Bill 108 (ER 0181) for 45 days to August 6.

OHBA made a submission responding to the three proposed regulations under Bill 108 on Tuesday August 6, 2019. OHBA thanks the members and local associations that provided input and feedback in support of our recommendations to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing. # **Provincial Policy Statement Review**

As part of the <u>More Homes, More Choice: Ontario's Housing Supply Action Plan</u>, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing has launched a consu proposed changes to the <u>Provincial Policy Statement</u> (PPS). The PPS is an important part of Ontario's land use planning system, setting out the provin use policy direction. The Planning Act requires that decisions on land use planning matters be "consistent with" the Provincial Policy Statement policies.

The government is consulting on draft policy changes to:

- · Encourage the development of an increased mix and supply of housing
- · Protect the environment and public safety
- · Reduce barriers and costs for development and provide greater predictability
- Support rural, northern and Indigenous communities
- Support the economy and job creation

The proposed PPS policy changes support the implementation of the OHBA supported *Housing Supply Action Plan*. The <u>OHBA submission to the Hous</u> <u>Supply Action Plan</u> included a number of recommendations to streamline the PPS and OHBA subsequently participated in consultations and provided fu recommendations for amendments to the PPS to reduce red tape while encouraging new housing supply. The proposed PPS changes are intended to we together with other recent changes to the land use planning system – including to the *Planning Act* through *Bill 108, More Homes, More Choice Act, 2019* proclaimed) and *A Place to Grow: Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe*.

### **Construction Act**

On July 18th, Attorney General Doug Downey announced a next step to the full implementation of a first-in-Canada Prompt Payment regime. The governi stated that this regime is intended to cut through red tape, help create and protect jobs and attract investment to the province.

The implementation of these changes will prevent payment disputes from delaying work on construction projects, speed up the payment process and redu and money spent on litigation for businesses.

Following an open selection process, ADR Chambers was selected as the successful candidate to serve as the Authorized Nominating Authority. This new will oversee the adjudication process for construction disputes, including the training and qualification of adjudicators.

This adjudication system brings into force a new process that will give people and businesses an alternative to settling payment disputes in court. Starting 1, subject to applicable transition rules, parties to construction contracts and subcontracts will be able to receive a binding decision from an experienced construction adjudicator in approximately six weeks, a process that could take months or even years in the court system.

# The Wright Kind of Tour: OHBA Summer Housing Study Tour


