

New Report "Baby Needs a New Home" Continues to Gain Momentum!



Did you know that Ontario needs **ONE MILLION** new homes over the next ten years to accommodate our growing population? This is the latest finding from Dr. Mike Moffatt in relation to population growth and new family formations report titled, <u>Baby Needs a New Home</u>. Mike Moffatt is the Senior Director of Policy and Innovation at the Smart Prosperity Institute and Assistant Professor in the Business, Economics and Public Policy group at the Ivey Business School, Western University.

In three virtual sessions for Southwestern, North/East and Central Ontario, OHBA and local HBAs hosted members and local municipal officials to discuss the latest population growth, family formations and housing demands in their communities. Mike's research showcases the significant dynamics playing out across Ontario in communities big and small, with family formations being created but leaving many of these individuals being priced out of their existing communities and driving until they qualify to find attainable and affordable housing

options.

OHBA has made these sessions and the full report available <u>on our website</u> and encourage all members and elected officials to read the report and see the growing demands that their communities are facing and will continue to face in the years to come. Amendments to Exempt Low-Risk Sewage Works from Requiring an Environmental Compliance Approval

OHBA has prepared a draft response to the Environmental Registry of Ontario (ERO) posting #019-4456 in support of the Ministry of Environment Conservation and Parks (MECP) initiative related to the above matter. These proposed changes represent MECP's continued focus on modernizing the environmental assessment process in order to cut red tape. The proposed changes will avoid confusion and reduce the time required to deal with private lot low-impact developments (LID's).

OHBA views this as a very positive move in that it will be beneficial towards reducing approval timelines and will assist our effort in the creation of much needed housing supply. In addition, OHBA views the proposed changes as encouraging the use of LID's which may have the benefit of decreasing downstream stormwater management requirements. Proposed Additional Delegation of Planning Decisions

OHBA has <u>submitted a response</u> to the *Environmental Registry of Ontario posting #019-4419* in support of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) initiative to provide municipalities with discretionary authority to delegate additional decisions to Committees of Council or municipal staff for minor amendments to zoning bylaws. The amendments proposed by MMAH would provide a new discretionary authority to delegate planning decisions dealing with minor amendments to zoning bylaws subject to criteria established

through official plan policies. This authority could include delegating decisions for temporary use bylaws, the lifting of holding symbols, and other minor zoning bylaw amendments. Such changes would not alter any notice or public meeting requirements or limit appeal rights. Please contact Larry Kotseff at lkotseff@ohba.ca should you have any related questions.

OHBA at Queen's Park



OHBA has been very active at Queen's Park since the legislature returned for the Fall session, speaking on a number of pieces of legislation.

In December 2020, OHBA joined the Ontario Professional Planners Institute along with a number of other key industry associations calling on the government to provide municipal councils with the ability to delegate additional Planning Act approvals to heads of planning departments. In October 2021, Bill 13, Supporting People and Businesses Act, 2021 brought in by Minister Nina Tangri, helped bring this to fruition and is a measure that is strongly welcomed by the residential construction sector. Municipalities across Ontario have professional planning staff in place who are well situated and knowledgeable to deliver on these measures and free up councils to focus on the significant and major decisions ahead instead of being overwhelmed with minor and administrative decisions. OHBA spoke strongly in favour of this legislation.

OHBA was also a strong advocate for Bill 27, *Working for Workers* Act, 2021. This legislation brought forward a number of measures to help unlock incredible skilled trade career opportunities for workers and make other changes that protect, support, and attract workers to our great province. This legislation will eliminate the Canadian work experience barrier to help internationally trained workers in 23 trades, including electricians, plumbers and

hoisting engineers while ensuring safety standards and competencies remain high. OHBA spoke in support of this legislation which will help employers address the skilled trade labour gap we are facing in communities across Ontario while unlocking countless new in-demand and well-paying career opportunities.

OBC Changes for January 2022

On January 1, 2021, there are new Ontario Building Code requirements related to stairs that come into force which members should be aware of. To assist members with these new requirements, OHBA is hosting buildABILITY President, Michael Lio on Wednesday, December 8^{th} from 11-Noon to help members navigate this change and the impacts it will have on projects. Members are encouraged to register for the session here.
