DEVELOPMENT CHARGES AND LAND-USE PLANNING ACT CONSULTATIONS

On Friday, November 29th, OHBA held an industry consultation in conjunction with the London Home Builders' Association with the aim of opening discussion and receiving feedback from members on the DCA and Land-use Planning Act review. The meeting was well attended by members in the local association, OHBA received good feedback to include in a submission.

OHBA will continue with the consultation process with the next industry consultation taking place in **Ottawa on Monday, December 9th at the Centurion Centre from 9:15 AM – 11:15 AM**. OHBA is looking for feedback and a wide range of ideas that will inform the content of the OHBA submissions to the provincial government. This is your opportunity to get engaged and provide your advice. Following these internal consultations at local HBAs, there will be other opportunities for member engagement with the ad-hoc committees. OHBA is seeking advice and recommendations from our members across the province. In addition, the provincial government is continuing to hold <u>a series of public consultations</u> in the evenings at a number of locations across Ontario. The meetings will be open to municipalities, industry stakeholders and the general public to provide feedback to the provincial government. OHBA strongly encourages members to attend and provide industry examples and perspectives. The next meeting will be taking place in **Mississauga on Thursday**, **December 5th** and an additional consultation will be taking place in **Toronto on Monday**, **December 9th**. OHBA DAY AT QUEEN'S PARK – NOVEMBER 6^{TI}

On Wednesday, November 6th, OHBA hosted a day at Queen's Park for our network of 30 local associations and their delegates. The day consisted of the OHBA Board of Directors meeting, a series of meetings for delegates to inform and educate MPPs on important OHBA and industry issues and ended with an evening reception that was attended by numerous Cabinet Ministers and MPPs.

The OHBA Board was joined by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing at lunch, where delegates were addressed by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Hon. Linda Jeffrey who noted how important the ongoing consultations on the Development Charges Act and the Land-Use Planning System are for the province of Ontario. The Minister restated how important the dialogue with the new housing and land development industry is for the consultations and that she welcomed OHBA's recommendations.

The MPPs meetings held throughout the day with OHBA Board members and Executive Officers were key opportunities for direct engagement between OHBA's network of local associations and our elected representatives from across Ontario.



The well-attended MPP reception provided yet another opportunity to provide decision makers with industry perspectives on development charges, parkland dedication, section 37 agreements and the land-use planning and appeals system.

ONTARIO WSIB MANDATORY COVERAGE DEADLINE IS JANUARY 1, 2014

Mandatory WSIB Coverage refers to the policies outlined in the *Workplace Safety and Insurance Act, 2008*. This legislation mandates independent operators and executive officers to purchase WSIB insurance. The legislation provides limited exemptions for residential renovations and executive officer not performing construction work. The legislation has been in force since January 1, 2013, with a one year transition for those in violation with the policies. On January 1, 2014, WSIB will begin issuing fines for anyone working without WSIB clearance certificate in construction. Exceptions to the Mandatory Coverage include home renovators who are contracted directly by the person occupying the residence and work exclusively in home renovations. Businesses can also select one executive officer or partner to apply for an exemption from coverage. For more information, please visit the WSIB website.

SPRINKLER AND FIRE PROTECTION INSTALLER REVIEW DELAYED

The deputations for the Sprinkler and Fire Protection Installer Trade have been postponed until January. Prior to the scheduled oral consultations on November 27th, the chair of the Review Panel notified stakeholders that he had once acted as legal counsel to United Association Local 853, who are a party advocating for compulsory certification of the sprinkler and fire protection installer trade. Several participants at the deputation, including OHBA, noted that this may constitute bias and affect the ruling. As a result, the Review Panel adjourned the oral consultation to give individuals who made submissions to the trade classification review a chance to provide comment on whether there is bias that would affect a ruling by the Chair. Any objections to the Chair's involvement will be heard on January 6th.

NATIONAL BUILDING CODE PROPOSED CHANGES ON WOOD-FRAME CONSTRUCTION

The <u>public review on proposed changes</u> to the National Model Construction Codes has been extended until December 23, 2013. In November, OHBA hosted two sessions with CHBA in GTA and London to review the changes on six-storey wood frame construction. To address emergency responder concerns, provisions allowing greater access for firefighting were proposed; for example, requiring that a minimum of 25 per cent of the building perimeter be directly accessible by fire responders. Other requirements include mandatory sprinklers (conforming to NFPA-13) throughout the building; a fire-resistance rating of no less than one hour for floor and roof assemblies as well as mezzanines; and non-combustible cladding on roofs that are inaccessible to fire hoses.

As the technical discussion at the national level on six-storey wood frame construction will inform Ontario's building code development, OHBA encourages members to participate in the review process and submit comments either directly to the <u>Canadian Commission on Building and Fire Codes</u> (CCBFC) or to OHBA. REVISED ENERGY EFFICIENCY DESIGN SUMMARY FORM AND FAQ

In response to OHBA 2013 Resolution #11, EEDS (Energy Efficiency Design Summary) Form Update, OHBA worked with OBOA, LMCBO and MMAH to revise the EEDS form and the accompanying FAQ. The key changes on the revised EEDS form incorporate amendments to SB-12 as of March 2013, including the following items:

Section B. Prescriptive trade-off options used Section D. Efficiency of drain water heat recovery (DWHR) units

Additional clarifications have also been made to Section C, "windows, skylights & glass" to reflect the wording in SB-12.
