Housing Sector Remains Resilient

Both Single Detached and Multi Family Housing Starts Increase

August 9, 2011 - Toronto, ON - "The new housing sector continued to experience strength this summer", says Ontario Home Builders' Association President Bob Finnigan, adding, "the July numbers are 30 percent higher than the same month last year. There is particular strength in the multi-unit category again, which is pushing the housing start numbers higher."

"The high levels of construction we are witnessing is producing significant economic dividends and creating thousands of jobs throughout the region." Finnigan cautions that "While the July numbers are strong, the majority of growth is just within the Greater Toronto Area. Other parts of the province are experiencing a more static environment." Finnigan adds that. "The very recent global economic news demonstrates the Bank of Canada needs to consider any future rate hikes with extreme caution, as the recovery may be more fragile than many believed."
